CONSENT AGENDA

A motion was made by Commissioner Kelley, duly seconded by Commissioner Baker, all members voting affirmatively and so carried to approve the consent agenda as read by Chairman Hutcheson. The consent agenda includes the minutes from the February 27, 2019 commission meeting and the claims docket for February 26, 2019 – March 11, 2019 in the amount of \$467,179.04.

DISTRICT 2 - ANNOUNCE WHITE GOODS PICKUP AND DUMPSTER FOR MARCH 18

<u>APPROVE PURCHASE AGREEMENT FOR UPGRADE TO TIME CLOCK SYSTEMS; \$19,834.50 TO BE</u> PAID FROM GENERAL FUND FUND BALANCE

A motion was made by Commissioner Kelley, duly seconded by Commissioner Watson, all members voting affirmatively and so carried to approve upgrading time clock systems for \$19,834.50 to be paid from General Fund fund balance.

SHERIFF – APPROVE PURCHASE OF RESTRAINT CHAIR FROM GENERAL FUND FUND BALANCE; \$2.172

A motion was made by Commissioner Shumate, duly seconded by Commissioner Watson, all members voting affirmatively and so carried to approve purchase of restraint chair from General Fund fund balance. At this time the Sheriff Department only has one restraint chair.

SHERIFF – APPROVE PURCHASE OF TASERS UNDER 5-YEAR LEASE AGREEMENT FROM GENERAL FUND FUND BALANCE; \$17,545 FOR FIRST YEAR, YEARS 2-5 WILL BE INCLUDED IN SHERIFF BUDGETS

A motion was made by Commissioner Kelley, duly seconded by Commissioner Shumate, all members voting affirmatively and so carried to approve purchase of 40 tasers under 5-year lease agreement from General Fund fund balance; \$17,545 for first year, years 2-5 of \$13,800 will be budgeted.

<u>SHERIFF – APPROVE PURCHASE OF CARD READER ACCESS SYSTEM; \$12,981.50 PAID FROM GENERAL FUND FUND BALANCE</u>

A motion was made by Commissioner Watson, duly seconded by Commissioner Kelley, all members voting affirmatively and so carried to approve purchase of card reader access system for the jail; \$12,981.50 paid from General Fund fund balance. This card reader will be compatible with the courthouse card reader for authorized personnel.

<u>SHERIFF – APPROVE PURCHASE OF CAMERA SECURITY SYSTEM; \$14,950.99 PAID FROM COURTHOUSE AND JAIL FUND</u>

A motion was made by Commissioner Watson, duly seconded by Commissioner Kelley, all members voting affirmatively and so carried to approve purchase of camera security system; \$14,950.99 paid from Courthouse and Jail Fund.

<u>DISTRICT 2 – APPROVE CONTRACT WITH JM WOOD AUCTION COMPANY TO SELL 2019</u> KENWORTH DUMP TRUCK; \$150,000 GUARANTEE SALE PRICE

A motion was made by Commissioner Watson, duly seconded by Commissioner Shumate, all members voting affirmatively and so carried to approve contract with JM Wood Auction Company to sell 2019 Kenworth Dump Truck; \$150,000 guarantee sale price.
