The Marshall County Commission met in regular session on Wednesday, April 28, 2021 at 10:00am in the Marshall County Commission Chambers.

Chairman Hutcheson called the meeting to order and asked County Attorney Clint Maze to lead the Invocation and Commissioner Shumate to lead the Pledge of Allegiance.

A motion was made by Commissioner Baker, duly seconded by Commissioner Watson, and all members voting affirmatively and so carried to approve the consent agenda as read by Chairman Hutcheson. A motion was made by Commissioner Watson, duly seconded by Commissioner Shumate, and all members voting affirmatively and so carried to approve agreement between Marshall County Commission and Marshall Medical Centers Medical Service, Arab Fire Department, the volunteer fire departments, for use of the Stryker Lukas 3 Chest Compression Systems that were purchased with Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Aid. This motion covered items 3-5 on the meeting agenda.

RESOLUTION VACATING PORTION OF GURLEY ROAD

WHEREAS, the District 2 Commissioner, James R. Watson, sought to vacate a portion of Gurley Road;

WHEREAS, notice was given pursuant to Alabama Law and a public hearing was conducted on April 28, 2021 at 9:00 am in the Commission Chambers of the Marshall County Courthouse in Guntersville, Alabama; and

WHEREAS, members of the public, and/or abutting landowners did not appear at the public hearing to voice objection to the said vacation;

WHEREAS, the road to be vacated is a portion of "Gurley Road" that is located in Marshall County, Alabama, more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

A PORTION OF GURLEY DRIVE RIGHT-OF-WAY TO BE VACATED LOCATED IN SECTION 29 AND 32, TOWNSHIP 5 SOUTH, RANGE 4 EAST, HUNTSVILLE MERIDIAN, MARSHALL COUNTY, ALABAMA, BEING MORE PARTICULARLY DESCRIBED AS COMMENCING AT A 2½ INCH DIAMETER BENT PIPE LOCATED AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE SOUTHWEST ¼ OF THE SOUTHEAST ¼, OF SAID SECTION 29. THEN N88°16'49"W A DISTANCE OF 242.79 FEET TO A POINT. THEN S75°48'03"W A DISTANCE OF 93.87 FEET TO A POINT. THEN S74°45'14"W A DISTANCE OF 135.09 FEET TO A POINT IN THE CENTER OF SAID GURLEY DRIVE, THE POINT OF BEGINNING. WHEREAS, the above described vacation is in the public interest in that State of Alabama Department of Conservation plans to construct a public camp ground and the road will be gated to provide control access to the camp ground area.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED as commissioners of Marshall County, Alabama, we hereby proclaim that the portion of Gurley Road is vacated, discontinued, abandoned and annulled so as to destroy the force and effect of any dedication by map, plat or otherwise and to divest any and all rights of the public, including any rights which may have been acquired by dedication of plat, prescription or otherwise in that part of the road are hereby vacated.
