JUVENILE PROBATION - APPROVE TO SUBMIT APPLICATION TO ALABAMA DEPARTMENT OF YOUTH SERVICES TO FUND FY2021-23 PROJECT MARSHALL COUNTY YOUTH ADVOCATE PROGRAM

A motion was made by Commissioner Shumate, duly seconded by Commissioner Baker, and all members voting affirmatively and so carried to approve to submit application to Alabama Department of Youth Services to fund FY2021-23 project Marshall County Youth Advocate Program.

APPROVE TO ACCEPT THE CORONAVIRUS LOCAL FISCAL RECOVERY GRANT

A motion was made by Commissioner Watson, duly seconded by Commissioner Baker, and all members voting affirmatively and so carried to approve to accept the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Grant in the amount of \$18,797,215.

APPROVE TO INCREASE COURTHOUSE AND JAIL FUND BUDGET BY \$25,000 FOR REPAIR OF STORM DAMAGE IN FRONT OF COURTHOUSE. ALL BUT \$5,000 WILL BE REIMBURSED BY INSURANCE

A motion was made by Commissioner Sims, duly seconded by Commissioner Baker, and all members voting affirmatively and so carried to approve to increase Courthouse and Jail Fund budget by \$25,000 for repair of storm damage in front of courthouse, all will be reimbursed except \$5000 in deductibles.

DISCUSS LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

District #2 Commissioner Rick Watson, Marshall County Commission's Representative on the Legislative Board updated the Commission on the 2021 County Legislative Report.

*Gov. Kay Ivey signed Act 2021-297 into law on April 27. Effective July 27, this new law will help resolve the continual confusion among local leaders and resident that stems from the municipal exercise of police jurisdictions. Specifically, the law will freeze current police jurisdictions parameters statewide and set up procedures for their seamless reductions.

*Gov. Kay Ivey signed Act 2021-348 into law on May 6. Effective August 1, this new law will allow local governments operating solid waste program to utilize excess program funds for other critical services provided to residents in the county or municipality.

*Gov. Kay Ivey signed Act 2021-390 into law on May 6. Effective immediately. This new law expands the Systems in Alabama, and provides a stronger voice to the more than 55,000 local government employees who represent 65 percent of Employees' Retirement System participants.
