The Marshall County Commission met in regular session on Wednesday, September 22, 2021 at 10:00am in the Marshall County Commission Chambers.

CONSENT AGENDA

A motion was made by Commissioner Baker, duly seconded by Commissioner Sims, and all members voting affirmatively and so carried to approve and amend the consent agenda presented as read by Chairman Hutcheson. The consent agenda includes the minutes from the September 8, 2021 meeting and the claims docket for September 7, 2021 – September 20, 2021 for \$471,595.69.

<u>SHERIFF – APPROVE TO INCREASE THE SHERIFF'S BUDGET BY \$65,000; \$47,200 FOR PAYROLL,</u> <u>\$15,000 FOR FUEL AND \$2,800 FOR CELLULAR SERVICE TO BE PAID FROM GENERAL FUND FUND</u> <u>BALANCE</u>

A motion was made by Commissioner Sims, duly seconded by Commissioner Baker, and all members voting affirmatively and so carried to approve to increase the Sheriff's Budget by \$65,000; \$47,200 for payroll, \$15,000 for fuel and \$2,800 for cellular service to be paid from General Fund fund balance.

SHERIFF – APPROVE TO INCREASE THE JAIL BUDGET BY \$203,000; \$178,000 FOR MEDICAL AND DENTAL FOR COUNTY INMATES, \$7,500 FOR NATURAL GAS, AND \$14,000 FOR WATER TO BE PAID FROM GENERAL FUND FUND BALANCE

A motion was made by Commissioner Sims, duly seconded by Commissioner Baker, and all members voting affirmatively and so carried to approve to increase the jail budget by \$203,000; \$178,000 for medical and dental for county inmates, \$7,500 for natural gas, and \$14,000 for water to be paid from General Fund fund balance.

<u>CORONER – APPROVE TO INCREASE THE CORONER'S BUDGET BY \$1,500 FOR</u> <u>TRANSPORTATION AND FREIGHT TO BE PAID FROM GENERAL FUND FUND BALANCE</u>

A motion was made by Commissioner Baker, duly seconded by Commissioner Shumate to approve to increase the coroner's budget by \$1,500 for transportation and freight to be paid from General Fund fund balance. Roll call vote Commissioner Shumate, yea, Commissioner Watson, nay, Commissioner Sims, yea, Commissioner Baker, yea. Motion passed with 3 yeas and 1 nay.

<u>APPROVE PERSONNEL BOARD RESOLUTION REQUESTING COST-OF-LIVING INCREASE</u> Motion died due to lack of motion.

APPROVE FY2022 BUDGET

A motion was made by Commissioner Baker to approved FY 2022 budget as presented and the Commissioner rescinded his motion. A second motion was made by Commissioner Baker, duly seconded by Commissioner Sims, and all members voting affirmatively and so carried to approve FY 2022 Budget with the budget changes originally submitted by the Rev Commissioner and to fund the merit raise for employees as requested by the personnel board.

APPROVE FINANCE COMPANY FOR NEW BOND ISSUE

A motion was made by Commissioner Sims, duly seconded by Commissioner Baker to award Bond Issue to Piper Sandler for the financing of upgrades to the Marshall County Jail. Chairman Hutcheson called for a roll call vote, Commissioner Shumate, yea, Commissioner Watson, nay, Commissioner Sims, yea, Commissioner Baker, yea. Motion passed with 3 yeas and 1 nay.

DISTRICT 1 – APPROVE PRELIMINARY PLAT FOR THE COVE PHASE III SUBDIVISION

A motion was made by Commissioner Shumate, duly seconded by Commissioner Watson, and all members voting affirmatively and so carried to approve preliminary plat for The Cove Phase III Subdivision as recommended by County Engineer.

DISTRICT 2 – APPROVE PRELIMINARY PLAT FOR SUNSET COVE SUBDIVISION

A motion was made by Commissioner Watson, duly seconded by Commissioner Sims, and all members voting affirmatively and so carried to approve preliminary plat for Sunset Cove Subdivision as recommended by County Engineer.

NOW THEREFORE be it resolved that the Marshall County Commission has designated the New Boaz Recreation Center located at 400 Elizabeth Street, Boaz, Alabama is referred to as the New Recreation Center as the Voting Place for Precincts 201.001, 201.002, 201.003, 201.004, 201.005, 201.006, 201.007, 202.001, 202.002, 202.003, 202.004, 202.005, 202.006, 202.007, 203.001, 203.002 and 203.003.
