CONSENT AGENDA

A motion was made by Commissioner Baker, duly seconded by Commissioner Shumate, and all members voting affirmatively and so carried to approve the consent agenda presented as read by Chairman Hutcheson. The consent agenda includes corrected minutes for March 8, 2023 and the minutes from the March 22, 2023 meeting, and the claims docket for March 21, 2023 – April 10, 2023 for \$2,336,666.28.

APPROVE TO ENTER INTO EXECUTIVE SESSION REGARDING POSSIBLE PENDING LITIGATION

<u>ENGINEERING – APPROVE PRELIMINARY PLAT FOR RE-SUBDIVISION OF LOT 17 IN PRESTON</u> CABIN SITE SUBDIVISION, DISTRICT 2

APPROVE DIRECT SUPPORT TO MARSHALL COUNTY SPORTS HALL OF FAME; \$500 COUNTYWIDE A motion was made by Commissioner Baker, duly seconded by Commissioner Shumate, and all members voting affirmatively and so carried to approve direct support to Marshall County Sports Hall of Fame for \$500 to be paid out of Countywide.

MAINTENANCE - APPROVE TO BID OUT FAN COIL UNITS AND BOILER FOR GVCH

A motion was made by Commissioner Sims, duly seconded by Commissioner Baker, and all members voting affirmatively and so carried to bid out Fan Coil Units and Boiler for GVCH.

CORONER – APPROVE PURCHASE OF TWO CHEVROLET SILVERADO'S FROM THE TOWN OF DOUGLAS: \$67,000 WITH AN ADDITIONAL REQUEST OF \$2,000 FROM THE GENERAL FUND FUND BALANCE TO USE FOR REMOVING GRAPHICS, APPLYING OUR GRAPHIC, AND ASSISTING WITH INSURANCE FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE YEAR

A motion was made by Commissioner Sims, duly seconded by Commissioner Shumate, to approve purchase of two Chevrolet Silverado's from the Town of Douglas: \$67,000 with an additional request of \$2,000 from the General Fund fund balance to use for removing graphics, applying our graphic, and assisting with insurance for the remainder of the year. Roll call vote was done, Commissioner Shumate, yes, Commissioner Watson, no, Commissioner Sims, yes, Commissioner Baker, no. Chairman Hutcheson cast the tie breaking vote of no. Motion failed with 3 nays, 2 yeas.
